Background:

Meeting Targets and Maintaining Epidemic Control (EpiC) is an eight-year (2019–2027) global health initiative project funded by President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR) and U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). EpiC has a presence in several countries and extensive breadth and depth of technical experience.

In Guinea, EpiC has been supporting Global Health Security to strengthen local capacity to prevent, detect and respond of infectious diseases. Under GHS, EpiC is strengthening global, regional, and local public health systems to effectively prevent, detect, and respond to infectious diseases, building on broad experience and existing capabilities that align with GHS priorities, National Action Plans for Health Security (NAPHS), and United States Agency for International Development (USAID) goals. In Guinea, EpiC will engage, support and provide technical assistance to One Health key stakeholders (animal, human, and environment) and private sector entities and associations to implement a comprehensive suite of strategies at national and prioritized regions/districts in the country in GHS focused areas to build the IHR core capacity required to prevent, detect, and respond to emerging and re-emerging infectious diseases that cause significant mortality, morbidity, and economic loss. This will involve collaboration with appropriate national stakeholders and partners.

We are seeking to employ a Project Director to lead the FHI 360 Global Health Security work and serve as the country representative for the FHI 360 office in Guinea.

Job Summary:

The Project Director leads the project and is responsible for achieving the project's vision and strategy, directing the project technical team, and managing critical relationships with national and international partners and other key stakeholders. The Project Director has overall programmatic and fiscal responsibility for the project, including achieving project results, effectively communicating accomplishments, making financial reports, and ensuring compliance with all US government and the organization's regulations. Plans and directs project schedules

and monitors budget/spending. Monitors the project from initiation through delivery. Organizes project(s) activities ensuring completion of the project on schedule and within budget constraints. Selects, develops, and evaluates personnel to ensure the efficient operation of the function. The Project Director will be a strong manager with expertise in public health with an emphasis on GHS, with operational and implementation expertise and deep experience leading USG programs.

Accountabilities:

- Responsible for creating, promoting, and maintaining safe and equitable work environments for all personnel, including a harassment- and violence-free work culture, and systems for safeguarding project participants.
- Plans, directs, and coordinates activities for designated projects to ensure that goals and objectives are accomplished within prescribed time frame and funding parameters.
- Reviews project proposals and plans to determine scheduling, budget, procedures, staffing, and allotment of resources needed for projects.
- Establishes work plans, project teams, and SOPs to meet project goals and ensure compliance with policies.
- Provides guidance and training to managers and staff to achieve project goals.
- Participates in the strategic development of methods and techniques with executive management.
- Establishes, serves, and maintains partnerships with internal and external stakeholders on project matters.
- Provide leadership to the project team, ensuring clarity over plans and priorities, encouraging effective teamwork.

- Liaises with donor personnel, including the USAID Mission and ensure the timely and complete submission of all performance reports and responses to donor requests for performance, success stories, and financial information for the program.
- Ensures that all program deliverables are met in a high quality and timely fashion.
- Ensures and oversees a clear technical strategy for the project and guarantees that technical excellence permeates all project activities.
- Provides managerial oversight to ensure compliance with all donor-related organization and program-specific policies and regulations.
- Ensures effective communication across the entire Guinea project with team and relevant stakeholders.
- Participates in international GHS networks, meetings, and select technical working groups as appropriate to represent the project and ensure collaboration with relevant technical work.
- Maintains up to date on GHS best practices and shares them with team members for learning and project enhancements.

- Leads the coordination of assessing and enhancing lab sample transport networks in Guinea
- Oversees the development and implementation of protocols to maintain sample integrity during transport
- Oversee the digitization and integration of electronic reporting systems to improve real-time tracking of sample movements and lab results
- Oversee the design and support the delivery of training programs for health works, transporters, and lab personnel on sampling handling, reporting, and emergency response protocols
- Manage the establishment of surge capacity mechanisms for sample transport and response to outbreaks, including rapid deployment strategies and community engagement initiatives
- Manage the development of performance indicators and frameworks to track progress in sample transport efficiency, data availability, and health system responsiveness.
- Supports performance management and professional development of direct reports, including ongoing feedback, coaching, and career support.
- Develops proposals and research sources for funding projects.
